 - o Ensure that social justice and equity are reflected in the design, implementation, and impact of the initiative
 - o Track progress, repair problems, expand or contract or shut down as necessary.
 - o Keep partners (NGOs, funders, regranters, key officials, top experts) happy and connected to and supportive of the work.
 - o Report, without coloration, on progress and stalls.
 - o Lead the decision-making on the initiative.

 - Serve as a sounding board and resource for other initiative directors and be constantly scanning for opportunities to expand the scope of the impact of this initiative, consistent with CIF's mission.

 - o Possess and continually enhance, a keen understanding of which policies, worldwide, can deliver the most carbon abatement. This will include partnering with the Vice President of Energy Innovation and a small analytics team to ensure substantiated data and trends drive the work.
 - o Track progress, and submit quarterly reports on progress, obstacles, and strategies.
 - o Work with the Executive Director from time to time to raise additional funds.

- o Meet with funders to present the strategy, work, and results.
- o Partner with CFO for needs related to overall operations management, legal, HR, IT, recruiting, etc.
